to certain U.S. Customs and Border Protection Officers.

Mr. PETERS (for himself and Mr. HAWLEY) introduced the following bill;  
which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Secu-  
rity and Governmental Affairs

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## A BILL

To correct the inequitable denial of enhanced retirement and  
annuity benefits to certain U.S. Customs and Border  
Protection Officers.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “U.S. Customs and Bor-  
5 der Protection Officer Retirement Technical Corrections  
6 Act”.

**7 SEC. 2. ADJUSTMENT RELATED TO TRANSITION RULES.**

8       (a) DEFINED TERM.—In this section the term “Elig-  
9 ble Individual” means any individual who—

1                             (1) received and accepted an offer of employ-  
2                             ment as a U.S. Customs and Border Protection Offi-  
3                             cer before July 6, 2008; and

4                             (2) entered into duty as a U.S. Customs and  
5                             Border Protection officer on or after July 6, 2008,  
6                             as a result of an offer described in paragraph (1).

7                             (b) TREATMENT OF ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.—Eligi-  
8                             ble Individuals—

9                             (1) are considered to be individuals serving as  
10                            U.S. Customs and Border Protection Officers on  
11                            July 6, 2008, for purposes of section 535(e) of the  
12                            Department of Homeland Security Appropriations  
13                            Act, 2008 (division E of Public Law 110–161; 121  
14                            Stat. 1844); and

15                             (2) are entitled to—

16                                 (A) the minimum annuity amount required  
17                             under section 535(e)(2)(C) of such Act; and

18                                 (B) an exemption from mandatory retire-  
19                             ment otherwise required under section  
20                             8425(b)(1) of title 5, United States Code.

21                             (c) IMPLEMENTATION.—

22                             (1) SUBMISSION OF INFORMATION.—Not later  
23                             than 120 days after the date of the enactment of  
24                             this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall—

25                                 (A) create a list of all Eligible Individuals;

1                                     (B) notify each Eligible Individual of the  
2                                     annuity correction described in subsection (b);  
3                                     and

4                                     (C) provide the Director of the Office of  
5                                     Personnel Management with all of the informa-  
6                                     tion that is necessary for making annuity cor-  
7                                     rections with respect to Eligible Individuals.

8                                     (2) COMPLETION OF ANNUITY CORRECTION.—  
9                                     After receiving the information described in para-  
10                                  graph (1)(C), the Director of the Office of Personnel  
11                                  Management shall make the annuity correction de-  
12                                  scribed in subsection (b) with respect to each Eligi-  
13                                  ble Individual, including a retroactive annuity ad-  
14                                  justment for Eligible Individuals who retired before  
15                                  the date of the enactment of this Act.

16                                     (d) WAIVERS AND GUIDANCE.—

17                                     (1) WAIVERS.—The Secretary of Homeland Se-  
18                                  curity may retroactively waive the maximum entry  
19                                  age requirement under 3307(g) of title 5, United  
20                                  States Code, to the extent necessary, to ensure that  
21                                  each Eligible Individual is eligible for immediate re-  
22                                  tirement with the annuity correction described in  
23                                  subsection (b).

24                                     (2) GUIDANCE.—The Director of the Office of  
25                                  Personnel Management, in consultation with the

1       Secretary of Homeland Security, shall issue appropriate  
2       guidance to assist in the implementation of  
3       the annuity correction described in subsection (b).

4       (e) GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY OFFICE.—The  
5       Comptroller General of the United States—

6               (1) shall review U.S. Customs and Border Protection (referred to in this subsection as “CBP”)  
7       hiring practices, policies, and procedures related to  
8       eligibility for enhanced retirement benefits referred  
9       to in this section by assessing—

11               (A) the process for determining whether an  
12       employee qualifies for such benefits, including  
13       considering any potential factors that would  
14       make an employee ineligible for such enhanced  
15       retirement benefits;

16               (B) the internal controls used by CBP to  
17       ensure that all eligible employees, and only eligible  
18       employees, receive such enhanced retirement  
19       benefits;

20               (C) the policies regarding the use of employees’ personnel files to ensure compliance  
21       with current laws governing retirement benefits;  
22  
23       and

1                             (D) the adequacy of the training provided  
2                             to CBP senior executives regarding human re-  
3                             sources and hiring practices at CBP; and  
4                             (2) not later than 18 months after the date of  
5                             the enactment of this Act, shall submit a report to  
6                             the Committee on Homeland Security and Govern-  
7                             mental Affairs of the Senate and the Committee on  
8                             Homeland Security of the House of Representatives  
9                             that describes the results of the review conducted  
10                            pursuant to paragraph (1).

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
