3	Agent Witness It is being conducted by the Senate
4	Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs and
5	the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations.
6	This interview was requested by Committee Chairman
7	Gary Peters, Ranking Member Rand Paul, as well as
8	Subcommittee Chairman Richard Blumenthal and Ranking Member
9	Ron Johnson. This is a part of the Committee's
10	investigation of the July 13, 2024, assassination attempt
11	on former President Trump, and the U.S. Secret Service
12	planning in advance of and response related to the events
13	in Butler, Pennsylvania, on July 13, 2024.
14	On July 25th, Chairmen Peters, Blumenthal, and Ranking
15	Members Paul and Johnson requested voluntary transcribed
16	interviews with U.S. Secret Service personnel, including
17	Witness
18	We will provide an explanation of how today's
19	interview will proceed, and before doing so I would now ask
20	Witness if you would please state your name and your
21	title for the record.
22	Witness My name is Special Agent Witness
23	HSGAC Majority And I'd ask if counsel would now enter
24	their appearance.

Witness Counsel -- I'm sorry. 1 MR. Yes. 2 MR. Go ahead, Larry. Sorry. This is Witness Counsel Vitness Counsel 3 MR. Okay. That's okay. Witness Counsel as in Witness Counsel 4 And I am outside counsel for Witness 5 Agency Counsel Attorney Advisor for 6 7 the Secret Service. HSGAC Majority There are four offices conducting this 8 interview today, and we will now introduce ourselves. 9 My name is HSGAC Majority I am the Chief Counsel and 10 Chief Investigative Counsel for Chairman Gary Peters on the 11 12 full Committee, the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee. And I am joined by my 13 colleagues HSGAC Majority Senior Investigative Counsel, and 14 **HSGAC Majority** Senior Investigator, both for the majority. 15 HSGAC Minority 16 Good afternoon. Thank you for coming My name is **HSGAC Minority** I am Chief Counsel for 17 Ranking Member Paul for HSGAC minority, and I'm joined by 18 my colleagues, HSGAC Minority and then HSGAC Minority 19 who will also be asking questions, as well. 2.0 This is PSI Majority 21 Senior Counsel 22 for PSI Chair Richard Blumenthal. Good afternoon, sir. My name is 23 Minority 24 I am the Deputy Staff Director for Ranking

Member Ron Johnson on the Permanent Subcommittee on

- 1 Investigations. I am joined today with my colleagues,
- 2 PSI Minority Chief Counsel, and PSI Minority our
- 3 Counsel.
- 4 HSGAC Majority During the interview we will try to ensure
- 5 we limit the number of people asking questions and follow-
- 6 ups so you can be sure to direct your responses to the
- 7 people asking the questions. And should you have any
- 8 questions about that follow-up we are happy to make sure
- 9 our questions are clear. Should you not understand the
- 10 questions, please ask us to revise them and we'll be happy
- 11 to do so.
- 12 We will proceed in approximate one-hour blocks of
- time, and we will take breaks afterwards, but if at any
- 14 time you feel the need for a break we're happy to
- 15 accommodate. Just let us know.
- The reporter is going to create a verbatim record of
- 17 what we discuss today, and with that in mind, as I'm sure
- 18 you're familiar, please respond verbally, because reporters
- 19 cannot properly record a nonverbal response. Do you
- 20 understand?
- Vitness I understand.
- 22 HSGAC Majority This interview is unclassified, so if the
- 23 questions call for any information that you know to
- 24 implicate classified information please state for the
- 25 record that the question implicates classified information,

- 1 and do your best to articulate the questions that do so.
- 2 And once you have clarified, to the extent possible, please

- Witness Yes, I understand.
- 9 HSGAC Majority The Committee's practice is to honor valid
- 10 common law privilege and claims as an accommodation to a
- 11 witness when those claims are made in good faith and
- 12 accompanied by a sufficiently explicit explanation. When
- deciding whether to honor the privilege, the Committee will
- 14 weigh its need for this information against a legitimate
- 15 basis for withholding it.

- integrity of our investigation. We also ask that you not
- 12 remove or make any copies of the photographs or exhibits.

- Witness Yes.
- 15 HSGAC Majority We will provide your counsel with a copy of
- 16 the transcript following the interview and an opportunity
- 17 to make any factual corrections.
- Do you have any questions before we begin?
- Witness No, sir.
- 20 HSGAC Majority Counsel?
- 21 MR. Agency Counsel No.
- 22 HSGAC Majority We would like to begin today's interview by
- 23 asking you first to give an overview of your roles and
- 24 responsibilities as they relate to your role at Secret
- 25 Service and the events on July 13th at the Butler rally.

- 1 This is with respect to your planning and security efforts
- 2 at the event.
- Witness I'm a Special Agent in the Donald Trump
- 4 Protective Division. I am a shift agent on Shift As an
- 5 additional duty I have -- I am in the Counter Unmanned
- 6 Aerial System Program. And on July 13th, in Butler,
- 7 Pennsylvania, in that capacity as a Counter UAS, it was the
- 8 reason for my being there.
- 9 HSGAC Majority My colleague, HSGAC Majority will now proceed
- 10 with questions.
- 11 HSGAC Majority Special Witness my name is
- 12 HSGAC Majority . I'm a Senior Investigator for Chairman Peters on
- 13 the Committee. Thank you again for being here. As
- mentioned, we're going to go around the table with each of
- 15 the different offices asking questions, and I'll start with
- the majority before we take a break in about an hour.
- Can you tell me how long you've been with the Secret
- 18 Service?
- 19 Witness I've been with the Secret Service
- 20 approximately four years.
- 21 HSGAC Majority And have you been on FPOTUS protective
- 22 detail since then?
- 23 Witness I've been on Donald Trump's protective
- 24 detail for approximately one year.
- 25 HSGAC Majority And what did you do with the Secret

1 amount of travel? 2 Witness Yes, sir. **HSGAC Majority** 3 What was your schedule like in the week leading up to the July 13 rally? 4 5 To the best of my recollection I was in Witness Bedminster, New Jersey, and then I had, I believe, a couple 6 7 of days off. I believe it was two days off. And then I traveled to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. 8 **HSGAC** Majority When did you travel to Pittsburgh? 9 Witness I traveled to Pittsburgh on July 11th. 10 HSGAC Majority So that would've been Thursday the 11th? 11 12 Witness I couldn't tell you. HSGAC Majority But two days before the rally? 13 Yes, sir. 14 Witness HSGAC Majority 15 Did you have any involvement in planning 16 for the July 13th rally? 17 itness Could you ask that question one more 18 time? HSGAC Majority 19 Did you have any involvement in planning for the rally, in any capacity? 20 21 Just for the UAS, counter UAS role. 'itness HSGAC Majority 22 Were you part of the Secret Service 2.3 advance team for that site?

HSGAC Majority And can you walk us through what that 1 advance planning for CUAS entailed? 2 3 Witness Sure. So typically, for counter UAS, we usually visit the site the day before the visit, and we're 4 looking for locations to **ES** the counter UAS system, and 5 6 getting a general understanding of the site and the plan 7 that's in place, and the location for me to work at, essentially to where I will detect drones. 8 **HSGAC** Majority So you said you usually visit the site 9 the day before. Did you do that in this case? 10 11 itness Yes. 12 HSGAC Majority So was that the 12th that you went to the Butler rally site? 13 14 Yes, sir. **Vitness** HSGAC Majority 15 And you said you usually identify a site for the CUAS technology. Did you do that in this case? 16 17 /itness I'm sorry? HSGAC Majority Did you identify a site for the CUAS 18 19 technology at this rally? **Nitness** 2.0 Yes, sir. HSGAC Majority 21 Yeah. And what was the location that you had selected? 22 2.3 Witness The location was approximately southeast 2.4 of the stage, a couple of hundred yards away from the

stage. That's the best description I can give.

- HSGAC Majority So that was on the opposite side of AGR 1 Is that right? 2 building, roughly. 3 Yes. itness HSGAC Majority Okay. What information did you rely on 4 ahead of the rally to plan? Were you given any documents? 5 I was given the Site Survey, and that's 6 Witness 7 usually handed out the day before the rally -- or excuse me, a visit. In this case, the rally. 8 **HSGAC** Majority Did you attend any briefings before the 9 10 rally? 11 itness Yes, I did. 12 ISGAC Majority What did you attend? On the 13th there was a 10:00 briefing 13 Witness concerning the site and the security plan. And I also, at 14 15 that time, I gave a couple of notes to the post-standers on 16 that day regarding my role and the assistance I needed from 17 them. HSGAC Majority 18 What assistance did you need from the 19 post-standers? So what I asked the post-standers is if 20 Witness they see a drone to notify the Security Room. 21 **HSGAC** Majority 22 Had you ever been to Butler before that 2.3 week? 2.4 No, sir.
- 25 HSGAC Majority And you said you attended the 10 a.m.

- 1 briefing at the rally site. Is that right?
- 2 Witness Yes.
- 3 **HSGAC Majority** So is it fair to say you were at the
- 4 site all day?
- 5 Witness Yes.
- 6 HSGAC Majority And were you at that CUAS location that
- 7 you described, being southeast of the stage, for the whole
- 8 day?
- Witness No, sir. So I was there initially,
- 10 following that 10:00 post-stander brief. However, I was
- 11 having issues with the counter UAS system and so I moved
- locations in an effort to try to get it up and running and
- have it active. It turns out, so I then moved to a
- 14 location adjacent to the Security Room, which was north of
- 15 the stage. And that's where I was at for the remainder of
- 16 the day.
- 17 HSGAC Majority The Security Room, you said north of the
- 18 stage?
- 19 Witness Yes, sir.
- 20 HSGAC Majority So that would be on the AGR side of the
- 21 stage?
- 22 Witness No, sir. That's -- I'd like to correct
- 23 that. It's to the 12 o'clock of the stage. So I believe
- it's north. Yeah, I would have to look at a map. But I
- 25 want to say it's north, but --

- 1 HSGAC Majority So -- sorry. Go ahead.
- 2 Witness It's directly straight ahead from the
- 3 stage, as you're speaking at the podium.
- 4 HSGAC Majority Understood. You said you identified
- 5 issues with the CUAS system. Could you elaborate on that,
- 6 what issues you encountered?
- 7 Witness Sure. So once I connect the system and
- 8 get it -- and have it set in its location, I am able to see
- 9 whether it's active, and it was not showing as active. And
- 10 then I went through troubleshooting procedures to try to
- 11 get it active. That proved to take me a few hours.
- 12 HSGAC Majority So what time did you first encounter the
- issue when it wasn't active?
- 14 Witness So I can, approximately 11:30, I'd say, I
- probably called someone to -- for assistance for the -- to
- help me walk through the troubleshooting process, or see if
- 17 they had any -- you know, he was more experienced with it,
- 18 to see if he's run into this issue before. It's the first
- 19 time I've encountered this system not becoming active. And
- so it must've been shortly before 11:30.
- 21 HSGAC Majority I'm sorry. Did you say this was your
- 22 first time with this system, in general, or this was the
- 23 first time you found the system to be inactive or not
- 24 operating?
- 25 Witness No. First time I've had the system not

- 1 become active.
- 2 HSGAC Majority I see. So you've worked with this
- 3 system before this rally?
- Witness Yes.
- 5 HSGAC Majority Understood. So the solution to it being
- 6 inactive was to move it to a different location. Is that
- 7 right?
- 8 Witness That was not the solution. Eventually,
- 9 at the end, after we found out what the trouble was. But
- 10 it was a solution that I thought would've helped, at the
- 11 time.
- 12 HSGAC Majority And did it help?
- 13 Witness No, it did not.
- 14 HSGAC Majority So then can you walk us through what
- 15 happened once you moved locations?
- 16 Witness The system continued to -- so once I
- moved the location I reconnected everything, tried to get
- 18 it active again. It still did not become active. A couple
- of people that I spoke to, that I phoned to try to assist
- 20 me with troubleshooting, but eventually it did not become
- 21 active until approximately 4:33. So when I called
- 22 Assistant Special Agent in Charge DTD 2nd Sup. to let him know
- 23 that it was active.
- 24 HSGAC Majority And do you have an understanding of what
- enabled it to become active and working?

Witness I think I do. So I'll walk you through 1 the process, if I may. So once I noticed the system was 2 3 becoming inactive, or not becoming active, I contacted a member of my detail who had more experience with it. So he 4 5 gave me some ideas and troubleshooting to do to the system. And then ultimately he gave me the number to a C-UASHQ 6 C-UAS HQ from D.C. I believe he's Secret Service Counter 7 UAS person that's in charge of the program. And so I spoke 8 9 to him. He gave me the number to 10 Tech Support, 11 and I spoke to them several times throughout the day. And 12 I worked with them, with the Tech Support personnel, at length, trying to get the system up. The Tech Support 13 14 person told me that the system, that they can see the 15 system, so I assumed it was a software issue. They told me 16 they were restarting the system automatically -- or excuse 17 me, remotely. They pushed updates to the system, but 18 nothing seemed to be working. 19 Sometime after 2 p.m., after troubleshooting for a few hours, I contacted ACAS DTD 2nd Sup. who was the second 20 21 supervisor that day, and I let him know that the system was 22 down and it doesn't look like we're going to be coming up, 23 it was going to be coming up. So after contacting him --24 let me add in there, I also let Special Agent Site Agent who 25 was the site agent that day, let her know that the system

- 1 was down. I continued to troubleshoot it myself, just to
- 2 the best of my abilities, turning it on and off,
- 3 reconnecting stuff.
- 4 At some time after 4 p.m., I get a call back from Tech
- 5 Support and says that another person from **ES** Tech
- 6 Support had looked at it, had looked at my system that was
- 7 connected, and it looked like two boxes -- please don't ask
- 8 me what these boxes are; it's beyond me -- but two boxes
- 9 were not talking to each other, and to try to change out an
- 10 Ethernet cable between those two boxes, that connected the
- 11 two of them. I looked around the Security Room and did not
- 12 find an Ethernet cable. I then went to the offstage
- announce area where the audio-visual personnel were at. I
- 14 explained to them that I needed an Ethernet cable. I
- 15 grabbed that. I switched out the cables, and shortly after
- the system became active. And at 4:33, I contacted ASAC
- 17 DTD 2nd Sup. to let him know that the system was active.
- 18 HSGAC Majority And you said you contacted Special Agent
- 19 Site Agent Can you remember when that was?
- 20 Witness No, I don't recall. I believe it was
- 21 before I contacted ASAC DTD 2nd Sup.
- HSGAC Majority Okay. And we'll circle back to these
- 23 CUAS issues. I just wanted to make sure I cover everything
- about the planning at the beginning of the rally.
- In terms of the security perimeter of the rally, does

- 1 the location of the perimeter affect what you do for CUAS
- 2 in any way?
- Witness No, sir, I don't believe so.
- 4 HSGAC Majority Were you aware of the location of the
- 5 perimeter?
- Witness Yes, sir, I was.
- 7 HSGAC Majority Who told you where the perimeter was or
- 8 what the --
- 9 Witness I had looked at the site diagram, and in
- 10 conversation on the 12th, walking through the perimeter --
- or excuse me, the site -- walking through the site, I knew
- 12 what the site was, and essentially the boundaries of the
- 13 site and where certain assets were going to be located.
- 14 HSGAC Majority But your responsibilities for CUAS
- extend beyond the perimeter. In other words, you're
- looking for drones outside of the perimeter as well as
- inside the perimeter?
- 18 Witness Absolutely. Yes, sir. So for that day,
- 19 the FAA has approved a temporary flight restriction zone of
- two nautical miles from 0 feet to 1,000 feet for UAS
- 21 systems.
- HSGAC Majority Does that means someone from the Secret
- 23 Service contacted the FAA before the rally about that zone?
- 24 Witness Yes, sir. We routinely make requests for
- 25 TFRs, temporary flight restriction zones, when former

- 1 President Trump is visiting locations.
- 2 HSGAC Majority Similar to my question about how the
- 3 perimeter affects your work, do any structures outside of
- 4 the perimeter, such as the AGR building, affect how you do
- 5 your job for CUAS? In other words, did you consider those
- 6 buildings or did you need to consider those buildings?
- 7 Witness No, sir. And something regarding the
- 8 flight restriction zone, so I mentioned it was two nautical
- 9 miles from 0 to 1,000 feet AGR, or above ground level. And
- it was specifically from 4:20 p.m. to 6:15 p.m. was the
- 11 times of the restrictions.
- HSGAC Majority Why did the TFR start at 4:20 p.m. as
- opposed to earlier or throughout the whole day?
- 14 Witness I believe it's from -- they're
- 15 calculating it from when President Trump will be on stage.
- 16 HSGAC Majority Do you know when that request was made
- 17 to FAA for that TFR?
- 18 Witness No, sir. I do not make those requests.
- 19 HSGAC Majority Did you have any concerns about the
- 20 perimeter or the location of the AGR buildings?
- Witness No, sir.
- 22 HSGAC Majority And going back to your arrival, you said
- you attended the 10 a.m. briefing. Do you recall what time
- 24 you arrived at the site?
- 25 Witness Probably 30 minutes before then.

HSGAC Majority Where were you the night before, so 1 Friday, the 12th? 2 3 I can't remember the city, but I was Witness within a 30-minute drive. 4 **HSGAC** Majority 5 Do you recall what you did that night, 6 before the rally? 7 Yes. So I sent out emails to the team, /Vitness that needed to be aware of the counter UAS, and we're going 8 9 to get alerts in the event that there was a drone. And 10 explaining that they will get messages or alerts on their 11 phones, and the need for some of them, specifically PI or 12 Protective Intelligence, agents or the CS, or Counter Sniper Response agent to respond in the event that we 13 14 detected an operator. **HSGAC** Majority 15 Were you made aware of any intelligence 16 about any threats ahead of the rally, so threats either to 17 the rally in particular or to former President Trump? - 22 me that -- so my reason for me to speak with him was to --

- 7 would say a few hours afterwards. It was -- during the --

- 11 assist at that time, from the Security Room. There were a
- 12 lot of persons coming in, medics, asking questions. But
- 13 yeah, I was primarily in the Security Room. At one point
- in time the Security Room agent asked me to take over

  - PSI Minority So in terms of your responsibilities

- 1 for connecting these two boxes together, you believe that
- 2 if you connect them with a certain wire then they should
- 3 function properly.
- Witness Sure.
- 5 PSI Minority And that wasn't the case that day.
- Witness Well, I connected the wires, the cable,
- 7 as I've always done and continue to do, and it just was not
- 8 working on that day. And we have since replaced it.
- 9 PSI Minority And you've never experienced that issue
- 10 before?
- 11 Witness Correct. I have not.
- 12 PSI Minority Have you ever experienced technical
- difficulties before with the system, prior this event?
- Witness No, sir.
- PSI Minority So you've had no experience interacting
- with Tech Support for this system before?
- Witness No, sir.
- 18 PSI Minority Okay. I want to go to the request
- 19 regarding the LES system that you mentioned before.
- Witness Yes, sir.
- PSI Minority When did TSD Advance Agent tell you that the
- 22 request was denied?
- 23 Witness It was after our initial phone call on
- 24 the 10th. I had two phone calls with him.
- 25 PSI Minority And you made the request on the 10th.

1 Is that correct? 2 Yes, sir. Witness PSI Minority 3 So you found out the same day that the request had been denied? 4 Yes, sir. 5 Witness PSI Minority And do you know how long, how many 6 7 hours or minutes between making the request and finding out that it was denied? 8 I don't know, sir. Not long after. 9 Witness PSI Minority 10 I'm sorry? Witness 11 Not long after. 12 PSI Minority Okay. And did explain to you why it was denied? 13 14 He did give me an explanation, and I do Witness not recall exactly. I believe it was being utilized 15 16 somewhere else. PSI Minority Are you aware of other Secret Service 17 protectees having an event in the general area that day? 18 19 Witness Yes, sir. I believe it was the First Lady having an event in -- at a casino nearby, or 20 relatively nearby. 21 PSI Minority Are you aware if, in her event, she had 22 **LES** system in place? 23 24 I do not know, sir. Witness Did anyone, TSD Advance Agent 25 PSI Minority or anyone else,

- say that the system that you requested is unavailable 1 because it's being used at the First Lady's event? 2
- Witness I don't remember specifically what he
- said, but yeah, I don't think he mentioned anything about 4
- the First Lady. I don't want to guess. I don't know 5
- specifically what he said, but he did explain a lack of 6
- 7 availability to me.

- PSI Minority I want to turn now to another issue 8
- that you raised regarding the event with the flight 9
- 10 restriction time.
- 11 Witness Yes, sir.
- 12 PSI Minority Is it TFR?
- 13 TFR. Yes, sir. Witness
- PSI Minority Is it called flight restriction time or 14
- 15 is it --
- Temporary Flight Restriction. 16
- PSI Minority 17 Temporary Flight Restriction. When did
- you raise the concern about that, about the length of that? 18
- 19 That would've been on the 12th. Witness
- PSI Minority 20 On the 12th?
- Witness 21 Yes, sir.
- 22 And who did you raise that to? PSI Minority
- To ASAC DTD 2nd Sup. 2.3 Witness
- 2.4 And did the ASAC pass along your SI Minority
- concern to anyone, as far as you know? 25

Witness I don't know if he did or didn't, sir. 1 **PSI Minority** Did you ask him to? 2 3 Witness No, sir, I did not. PSI Minority But as far as you know, the request for 4 a longer period of time never occurred. Is that correct? 5 I just want to clarify. I did mention 6 Witness 7 that we needed longer times, but -- that we should have longer times during events, and I didn't receive anything 8 afterwards saying that it was extended. 9 How did you make that request to the 10 PSI Minority ASAC? Was it written --11 12 It was in person. Witness PSI Minority 13 In person? 14 Witness Yeah. PSI Minority 15 Okay. And for other events that you've 16 worked that have the TFR, is that time usually just for 17 when the protectee is at the event, or is it for a longer period of time? 18 19 It's typically just for when the Witness 2.0 protectee is at the event. Minority 21 Understood. So in this instance, when you made this request for this event, what made you want to 22 2.3 make that request for the July 13th rally, specifically? 2.4 Just because I've seen it expire at other Witness

events where he was speaking, and I wanted to have the -- I

- 1 would've preferred to have the TFR in place for the
- 2 duration of the time.
- 3 **PSI Minority** Who makes the request for the TFR?
- 4 Witness I believe it starts in our Operations
- 5 Section, and it goes to D.C., Special Operations Division,
- 6 and I believe then to the FAA.
- 7 PSI Minority And in this case do you know when the
- 8 request was made, the TFR request?
- 9 Witness No, sir, I do not.
- 10 PSI Minority Did you speak to FAA yourself about the
- 11 TFR request?
- 12 Witness No, sir, I did not.
- 13 **PSI Minority** If, just generally speaking about TFR,
- if a drone is spotted outside of TFR, how do you respond to
- 15 that, if at all?
- 16 Witness Yeah. If it's outside of the TFR I
- 17 typically would not respond unless it's -- unless it would
- 18 be LES . But typically it would not.
- 19 Or maybe in the route of the **ES** potentially. But we
- 20 would not respond outside of the TFR zone.
- 21 PSI Minority So if, in this case, the report is that
- 22 Mr. Crooks flew a drone in the area around 3:50 p.m., I
- 23 believe. That would've been outside of the TFR. Had your
- 24 systems been operable it may have spotted it, but could you
- explain, in that specific case, what response would've

1 occurred? Witness Sure. It may have spotted it, and if it 2 3 did spot it, being that it was outside of the TFR window, I would've asked the PI personnel to respond and do a 4 consensual interview. PSI Minority 6 And PI is --7 Protective intelligence -- and do a consensual interview. Again, but that would've been legal 8 for them to be flying at the time. 9 PSI Minority So you would've -- you personally 10 11 would've sent people to engage with whoever was flying the 12 device? 13 Yes. And would you have had to report to 14 15 anyone up your chain of command or on the radios that you 16 took that action? 17 Witness Yes. And who would you have had to report 18 PSI Minority 19 that to? Potentially to, Site Agent was in charge of Witness 20 the site, and ASAC DID 2nd Sup. if it was during the time that 21 **ES** was -- actually, President Trump -- would have been 22 2.3 at the site. 2.4 SI Minority I want to go to that point, which is if

something is detected during the TFR, what actions do you

- 1 take in that case?
- 2 Witness Sure. If it was during the TFR then
- 3 there would be a PI interview, and then it wouldn't be
- 4 consensual at that point. The person would be detained and
- 5 interviewed, questioned. And it would be made of record
- 6 with the Secret Service.
- 7 PSI Minority I believe you mentioned earlier -- and
- 8 please correct me if I'm wrong -- that the Pennsylvania
- 9 State Police offered to provide drones at this event. Is
- 10 that correct?
- 11 Witness Sure. So they did. But to give you
- 12 context, my mission there was to detect drones that were
- coming into the site, that were unknown or unfriendly
- 14 drones. My job was not to build a security plan separate
- from the security plan that was there. So my question to
- them was, "Are you flying a drone?" Their question is,
- "No, we're not flying a drone." And then they mentioned,
- 18 "We can fly a drone if you need or want it." I believe I
- 19 had a conversation with him on the phone over what do you
- 20 guys particularly use it for, and he said something about
- overwatch, for search warrants. But yeah.
- 22 **PSI Minority** And approximate when was that
- 23 conversation?
- Witness That was on the 12th.
- 25 **PSI Minority** The 12th. Did you communicate this

- offer to anyone else in your chain of command?
- Witness No, sir, I did not.
- 3 **PSI Minority** Why not?
- 4 Witness I assumed that -- so I go out to the site
- 5 the day before the site. The rest of the advance team has
- 6 been there and has been in contact with the police for a
- 7 week prior to my arrival. So the plan that they had in
- 8 place is the plan that's going to go into effect. I wasn't
- 9 there to change the plan or add a different security plan.
- 10 **PSI Minority** Okay. I want to get to the plan that
- 11 you just mentioned in a moment, but a few other questions.
- 12 You mentioned that you were in the Security Room during the
- 13 July 13th event. Correct?
- Witness Yes, sir.
- 15 PSI Minority Were there other local law enforcement
- 16 agents or officials in the Security Room?
- 17 Witness There was Pennsylvania State Police.
- 18 Pennsylvania State Police are the ones that I saw there all
- 19 day long. I believe there was paramedics or emergency
- services personnel in and out of the room on that day, as
- 21 well, from the local side. And so yeah, I guess those were
- 22 the two that I've seen throughout the day, at least prior
- 23 to. It was filled afterwards, after the shooting.
- PSI Minority What communications did you have access
- 25 to that day, whether it be radio, phone, text, email?

Witness So I have access to my phone and the 1 radios that were in the Security Room. 2 PSI Minority 3 You had access to -- just so I understand -- all the radio frequencies in the Security 4 5 Room? 6 Vitness Yes, sir. 7 SI Minority Did you hear or receive any communications indicating issues at the AGR building? 8 9 Yes, seconds before, yes. SI Minority 10 Could you describe what you heard? 11 Witness Sure. And for context if I can back up -12 'SI Minority 13 Sure. 14 -- to give you context. So approximately 15 5:50, Pennsylvania State Police guy, the gentleman that I 16 just mentioned, said they have a picture of a guy, that one 17 of the local snipers have a picture of a guy that was suspicious. So I offered to the Security Room agent to 18 19 send out the CS response to the building, or to find the individual. Let me back up. The PSP personnel, 20 Pennsylvania State Police guy, mentioned that he was in the 21 22 vicinity of the Sheetz -- a Sheetz gas station, that was a 23 ways away from our site. And so I mentioned to the 2.4 Security Room agent that he should -- we can deploy the CS

response guy to go speak to this individual. And he agreed

- 1 and he went to go look for him.
- 2 PSI Minority I'm sorry. He went to -- just repeat
- 3 that last part again.
- 4 Witness Yeah. The CS response guy went to go
- 5 look for him. Let me back up a little bit more, actually.
- 6 And then the Pennsylvania State Police sent me a -- the
- 7 picture that they had of the individual. So I sent that
- 8 picture to the CS response, and then after sending him that
- 9 picture I called him on the phone, told him to try to make
- 10 contact with this individual. And he went out and he
- 11 responded. And, you know, the distance of the Sheetz gas
- 12 station and it was going to take him some time to get
- 13 there, but he was going out there. And the next update we
- 14 had --
- PSI Minority Before you get to the next update can I
- just unpack that, what you just said? I just want to make
- 17 sure that I understand. So approximately 5:50, you think -
- 18 -
- 19 Witness Yeah, approximately 5:50.
- 20 **PSI Minority** -- you receive a picture --
- Witness Yes.
- 22 **PSI Minority** -- from an individual in the
- 23 Pennsylvania State Police?
- Witness From the Pennsylvania State Police person
- 25 that was sitting in the Security Room.

1	PSI Minority And you received this picture from him
2	via email?
3	Witness Via text message.
4	PSI Minority And who was this individual that sent
5	you this picture via text message?
6	Witness I don't know his name. He was the
7	Pennsylvania State Police sergeant that was in the Security
8	Room throughout the entire day.
9	PSI Minority And he sent this picture to your
10	official Secret Service-issued phone?
11	Witness No. I asked him to send it to my
12	personal phone because our phones have issues with sending
13	out picture.
14	PSI Minority And so he sent this picture to your
15	personal phone.
16	Witness Yes, he did.
17	PSI Minority And what was the could you please
18	describe the picture that you received?
19	Witness Yeah. It was a picture of the
20	individual.
21	PSI Minority Just one picture?
22	Witness It was three pictures. Two different
23	angles of the individual and I believe it was a bike.
24	PSI Minority I'm sorry, the third picture?
25	Witness And a bike.

**PSI** Minority Okay. Did this person indicate how he 1 received these pictures? 2 3 Yes. I believe he received it from CS Witness Response -- or excuse me -- the local snipers. 4 PSI Minority 5 The local snipers? Witness 6 Yes, sir. 7 PSI Minorit∨l And at that point did you have any indication where those local snipers were located? 8 Yes, I knew where they were located. 9 **PSI** Minority Where were they located? 10 Witness 11 In the AGR -- what I know now to be the 12 AGR building. I just want to point out that they mentioned that he was in the vicinity of the Sheetz gas station. 13 That's where I asked the CS Response, Special Agent 14 CSRT Agent to go to. 15 PSI Minority The CS Response was Special Agent 16 CSRT Agent you said? 17 Yes. 18 Witness Okay. I'm going to ask you a few more 19 PSI Minority follow-ups before you move on, just to make sure that I 20 understand. So when you received these pictures and you 21 got the message about the Sheetz location, did you know 22 2.3 where these pictures were taken? 2.4 No. Vitness

And once you received these images, did

- 1 you share the pictures with anyone else?
- 2 Witness No. Just with the CS Response.
- 3 PSI Minority And how did you share these images with
- 4 CS Response?
- 5 Witness I sent them to his government phone.
- 6 **PSI Minority** Via text?
- 7 Witness Via text, yes.
- 8 PSI Minority Not email. Text.
- 9 Witness Text, yeah.
- 10 PSI Minority Okay. And approximately what time did
- 11 you send him those images?
- 12 Witness Approximately 5:51.
- 13 **PSI Minority** Okay. And how did you instruct this
- individual -- Special Agent CSRT Agent is that correct? --
- 15 how did you instruct Special Agent CSRT Agent to go take a
- 16 look at this situation?
- Witness Well, generally speaking, I told him that
- this was a suspicious individual, and that was spotted by
- 19 local snipers, and we wanted him to detain him and
- 20 interview him, potentially.
- 21 PSI Minority And how did you communicate that to
- 22 him?
- 23 Witness Over the phone.
- PSI Minority And where was Special Agent CSRT Agent
- 25 located at this time?

- Witness I couldn't tell you. Somewhere on the 1 site, I assume. 2 PSI Minority 3 Did you know if he was in proximity to AGR and that location, or you didn't know? 4 5 I did not know where he was at. Witness PSI Minority 6 And in addition to receiving these 7 images, did you receive any other information about this individual to indicate that he is suspicious? 8 Witness 9 Yeah. So the PSP did mention that he had 10 a rangefinder on him. PSI Minority 11 And that was in his text message to 12 you? No. That was in person. He was sitting 13 Witness 14 in the Security Room. PSI Minority 15 Okay. I understand. Based on your 16 professional background and experience, to you, is that 17 suspicious for an individual to have a rangefinder? Witness 18 Yes. 19 Minority And why? Witness Well, a rangefinder would give you 2.0 ranges, you know, wanting to know distance to certain 21 locations from my, you know, military background, it tells 22 2.3 me -- it raises concerns of why somebody would want to know
  - PSI Minority Did the PSP indicate to you how he

certain distance around the site.

- 1 received these images and information about the individual?
- 2 Did he receive a text message? Did he receive a radio
- 3 communication? Both? Do you know?
- 4 Witness I can't tell you exactly how he received
- 5 it, but he had it on his phone, so I could assume he
- 6 received it to his phone, as well.
- 7 PSI Minority Do you still have these messages on
- 8 your personal device?
- 9 Witness Yes. Yes, I do.
- 10 PSI Minority Okay. We would just communicate that
- 11 we would be interested in receiving that --
- Witness Sure.
- PSI Minority -- those message.
- 14 Witness Yeah. I made them available to Secret
- 15 Service, I believe. They probably turned them over to you
- 16 already. But yes, they're available.
- 17 PSI Minority Okay. Thank you. I'm running out of
- 18 time, but if it's okay with everyone else I'd like to be
- 19 able to continue the next steps that occurred, unless
- anyone else needs a break at this moment.
- [No response.]
- 22 PSI Minority Okay. If you wouldn't mind continuing,
- 23 sir. After you informed the CS Response.
- Witness Yeah. So CS Response went out, and I
- 25 believe, to my knowledge, PI also went out to try to locate

- 1 the individual. I did not speak to her, but possibly it
- 2 could've been the Security Room agent that did.
- 3 **PSI Minority** And who is that individual?
- 4 Witness -- I don't remember his last name.
- 5 PSI Minority Okay. You mentioned this person
- 6 previously.
- 7 Witness Yes.
- 8 PSI Minority And how were you in communication with
- 9 these individuals as they went to this area?
- 10 Witness I was only in communication with the CS
- 11 Response, Special Agent CSRT Agent and it was by phone.
- 12 **PSI Minority** So did you remain on the phone with him
- 13 as he went to this location?
- Witness No.
- 15 PSI Minority Okay. Did he -- was he giving you
- updates or was he communicating with you in any way as he
- was going to this location?
- 18 Witness I called him a few times. You know,
- 19 initially -- I called him a few times. I probably spoke to
- 20 him once or twice. The last time I spoke to him, for sure
- 21 that I remember, is a few minutes after, when the PSP
- 22 sergeant mentions that there's an individual on the roof,
- on a roof. And then I called CSRT Agent and was able to
- tell he's on a roof. I don't believe I told him
- 25 specifically what roof it was because I didn't know what

- 1 roof it was. The PSP sergeant later, I think he gave an
- 2 update seconds after that it was the AGR roof. I remember
- 3 looking at my phone for an AGR roof, or AGR building in the
- 4 vicinity of the Sheetz gas station. And it was seconds
- 5 after that he says AGR roof. I heard over the Channel radio
- 6 that, "Shots fired. Shots fired. Shooter down."
- 7 PSI Minority Okay. I just want to break down again
- 8 a couple of the things that you said. So you mentioned
- 9 that you were in contact with Special Agent CSRT Agent a few
- 10 times as he was responding. Are you able to tell us the
- 11 precise times that you called him?
- 12 Witness No. I couldn't tell you specifically
- 13 what time I called him.
- PSI Minority Did you call him from your personal
- 15 phone?
- Witness No, from my government phone. I don't --
- 17 yeah, I don't have -- from my government phone and to his
- 18 government phone. I don't have his personal phone.
- PSI Minority Did you save your call records?
- 20 Witness Yes, sir, I did, and I made them
- 21 available to the Secret Service.
- PSI Minority We would like those, as well. I
- 23 appreciate you for making those available.
- Vitness Yes, sir.
- 25 PSI Minority So did Special Agent CSRT Agent ever

- 1 call you to report to you, or were you the one taking the
- 2 initiative to call him?
- Witness I believe I called him. After the event
- 4 I think he called me. But initially, if I can recollect
- 5 correctly, I was the one calling him.
- 6 PSI Minority And were you calling him after
- 7 receiving updates from the PSP about the location of the
- 8 individual?
- 9 Witness I think it was before and after. I
- 10 wanted to get updates on his progress, of where he was
- 11 going and locating him. And then I certainly called him
- 12 after, when PSP informed us that, or at least tried, that
- 13 he was on the roof.
- PSI Minority Did you ever hear any communications
- 15 stating that an individual had a gun --
- Witness No, there was --
- PSI Minority -- and on top of the roof of AGR?
- 18 Witness No, there was no communication at all on
- 19 the Secret Service side about an individual with a gun.
- 20 **PSI Minority** Understood. But just to be specific
- 21 and clear on my part --
- Witness Yes, sir.
- 23 PSI Minority -- did you hear any communications from
- 24 any radio frequencies?
- Witness No, there was -- no.

PSI Minority Okay. And was Special Agent CSRT Agent 1 able to locate this individual? 2 Witness Yes, he did. Well, after the shooting he 3 made it to the roof, from my knowledge. 4 PSI Minority Prior to the shooting, do you know if 5 Special Agent CSRT Agent saw the individual on the roof? 6 7 Witness No. You do not know if he saw him on the 8 PSI Minority 9 roof. 10 To my knowledge he did not see him. Witness Okay. Did you ever ask Special Agent 11 PSI Minority CSRT Agent if he saw an individual on the roof? 12 After the event? No. 13 Witness PSI Minority 14 Could you describe what Special Agent CSRT Agent looks like? 15 He's a white male, athletic fit, 16 approximately 5'8", maybe, somewhere around 5'8". That's 17 the best description I can give. 18 Do you know the color hair? 19 PSI Minority No, I don't remember his color of hair. 20 Witness PSI Minority And did you personally carry radios 21 yourself that day? 22 2.3 Yes, I did. 2.4 And these were Secret Service-issued SI Minority

radios?

- Witness Yes, sir, they were.

  PSI Minority They were not local law enforcement-
- 3 issued radios?
- 4 Witness No.
- 5 PSI Minority Did you ever attempt to obtain local
- 6 law enforcement-issued radios?
- 7 Witness No.
- 8 PSI Minority Would it be typical for you to have
- 9 local law enforcement-issued radios?
- Witness No, sir.
- PSI Minority One moment.
- 12 [Pause.]
- PSI Minority I think we'll take a break now, if that
- works for everybody, and we'll go off the record.
- 15 [Recess.]
- 16 PSI Majority Thank you again for coming to answer
- 17 questions today. I just had a couple of quick questions I
- 18 wanted to ask to go back over, from the beginning. My
- 19 colleague with HSGAC majority, was asking about your
- 20 background, and I just kind of wanted to get a little bit,
- 21 flesh that out a little bit more.
- Where did you go to college?
- 23 Witness I went to college at Mercyhurst
- 24 University in Erie, Pennsylvania.
- 25 PSI Majority And did you, after that did you serve

- 1 in the military or the police force?
- 2 Witness Yes. I was in the Army for 10 years.
- 3 PSI Majority And so how did you transition from the
- 4 Army to the Secret Service?
- 5 Witness I applied for the job.
- 6 PSI Majority What's typically the selection
- 7 criteria to work for the Secret Service?
- Witness Generally you have to be a U.S. citizen,
- 9 not have a negative criminal record. Yeah, I've never
- 10 worked there as a recruiter so I can't tell you everything
- 11 that's a requirement.
- 12 **PS Majority** I mean, I guess from a civilian
- 13 perspective I look at the Secret Service and it seems like
- 14 it would be like the Olympics of law enforcement. It's a
- very highly regarded, respected organization. So I guess
- my assumption, again as a civilian, is that only exemplary
- 17 candidates become Secret Service -- you know, join the
- 18 Secret Service. Do you know what skill it was or what you
- 19 were best at that made you a successful candidate?
- 20 Witness As much as I would like to think or say
- 21 something great, no, I don't think it's anything specific.
- 22 I think the model of Secret Service is to look at the
- 23 entirety of the person and their experience.
- 24 **PSI Majority** And so you said before you were
- working for former President Trumps detail, that you were

- 1 working on criminal investigations in Chicago. Is that
- 2 accurate?
- Witness Yes, that is accurate.
- 4 PSI Majority And how long did you work in that
- 5 role?
- 6 Witness I was assigned to the Chicago Field
- 7 Office for three years. I was there for two, for
- 8 approximately two years.
- 9 **PSI Majority** Did you do anything before that?
- 10 Witness Before that was training.
- 11 PSI Majority How long does training last?
- 12 Witness I believe there's three months training
- in Georgia, with DHS, and then there's an additional four
- 14 months in the Rowley Training Center in Maryland.
- PSI Majority And so why were you, do you know why
- 16 you were selected to work in criminal investigations?
- 17 Witness So generally that's the move you'll go to
- from straight out of the Academy. You'll go to a field
- 19 office and do duties as a criminal investigator.
- 20 **PSI Majority** Was there a specific kind of
- 21 investigation you were beginning to specialize in, or did
- they kind of, were you a generalist?
- Witness No. I worked in the Financial Crimes
- 24 Task Force or Squad in Chicago, and then I moved to Task
- 25 Force, but I wouldn't say anything specific.

PSI Maiority So do you know why you were assigned 1 to the Trump detail? 2 3 Witness There was an opening that was made available to the Secret Service, and I applied, and I was 4 5 selected as one of the ones to go. PSI Majority And you said that you were on the 6 7 Trump detail for a year, and in the anti-drone team for three months. Is that correct? 8 9 Approximately three months, yes. PSI Maiority And do you know why you were selected 10 for that role? 11 12 No. My supervisor asked me if I was Witness interested, and I was, so then I was put in that role. 13 PSI Majority Did you receive any specialized 14 15 training? I received the hands-on training from IPO 16 IPO 17 **PSI** Majority And do you know approximately how long 18 that hands-on training lasted for? 19 It wasn't very long, less than an hour. 20 And so do you use a firearm? Do you 21 have a firearm in the field? 22 2.3 Yes, I do. 2.4 What kind of firearm do you use? 25

PSI Maiority If you were to deploy that weapon in 1 the field and it jammed, would you know how to clear that 2 3 weapon? 4 Witness Yes. 5 Were you trained in that? Yes, I was. 6 Maiority 7 Were you ever trained in troubleshooting the machine, the equipment used to detect 8 9 drones? 10 No. Maiority 11 I guess that's kind of something that 12 I'm having a hard time understanding. I understand you don't, you know, run the Secret Service, but, you know, 13 when you said that there were two boxes that don't talk to 14 each other, how many pieces of equipment? You said there's 15 16 the equipment. How many components are inside of that case? 17 There's the two boxes, and there's four 18 Witness 19 antenna nodes, and that's the entire system. PSI Majority And no one ever sat you down and 2.0 walked you through what all of the different pieces do or 21 22 give you like an in-depth discussion of how the system 2.3 works? 2.4 Vitness I did. Again, walked me

through it, explained to me how it worked.

PSI Maiority For approximately an hour, you said. 1 Witness Yes. 2 3 Maiority And was there anybody else at the Butler site who was responsible for setting the machines up 4 5 or making sure that they were working appropriately? Witness By machines do you mean the 6 7 system? PSI Majority The equipment. 8 9 Just me. 10 I think that is it for my questions. Maiority 11 Thank you. HSGAC Majority 12 Special Witness thank you again for the time. I've got a few follow-up questions, and 13 apologies. We have covered some of these. I just wanted 14 15 to make sure I really understood what you said earlier. Witness 16 Sure. **HSGAC** Majority 17 Going back to the troubleshooting you were doing with the CUAS equipment, you said you moved from 18 19 one location to the other. That was as part of your troubleshooting. Is that right? You moved because you 20 21 thought that might help fix the problem? Witness 22 Yeah. I can't remember who it was -- I 2.3 don't recall exactly who it was that asked me if there were 2.4 satellites nearby, and I said yes, there were some

satellite trucks nearby. And so I moved location to get

- 1 further away from those satellite trucks that may be
- 2 interfering with the system.
- 3 HSGAC Majority And to clarify, I think what you said
- 4 earlier, mobile cell networks -- so in layman's terms the
- 5 public cell network -- I think there are two cell towers at
- 6 that site, whether it's Verizon, AT&T, et cetera, public
- 7 domain cell service had nothing to do with the
- 8 functionality of that CUAS system? It didn't rely on that
- 9 public domain cell network?
- 10 Witness If I said it didn't I want to correct
- 11 that. I think it does.
- 12 HSGAC Majority Okay. My apologies.
- 13 Witness I'm not 100 percent sure, but I know the
- 14 system has a SIM card, so I think it does. I'm fairly
- 15 certain it does.
- 16 HSGAC Majority Okay, and apologies. I may be
- 17 misremembering what you said earlier. What is your
- 18 understanding of how the CUAS system interacts with the
- 19 mobile cell networks?
- 20 Witness I don't know how it interacts with it. I
- 21 believe that it does. The technical aspect of how it
- 22 communicates to it I don't know.
- 23 HSGAC Majority Okay. But is it your understanding that
- the equipment has to be connected to a mobile network in
- order for it to be functioning?

- 1 Witness To like a -- I think it needs cell
- 2 signal, cellular signal, to my knowledge. So if that's
- 3 what you mean by mobile network, yes.
- 4 HSGAC Majority But you had said earlier that your
- 5 understanding was that the problem was the Ethernet cable
- 6 but not connecting to the cellular networks?
- 7 Witness Correct, yeah. So once I knew that it
- 8 was the Ethernet cable, or was told by Tech Support that it
- 9 was possibly the Ethernet cable, I immediately switched it
- 10 out and it seemed to be working. For the entirety of the
- 11 time before that there's some lights that come on, and they
- were green, so I didn't think it was a connection issue.
- 13 HSGAC Majority Okay. And you said to your knowledge it
- does require a connection to the cell networks to work. At
- any point when you were troubleshooting did you happen to
- 16 note that it was not connecting to the cell networks?
- 17 Witness The only way for me to know if it's
- 18 connected is if it tells me it's active, and it was not.
- 19 It was not telling me that it was active, so I don't know.
- 20 It never tells me it's connected to a tower. It just tells
- 21 me whether it's active or not.
- 22 HSGAC Majority Okay. And it was inactive. That's what
- you were trying to troubleshoot.
- Witness Yes.
- 25 HSGAC Majority And the thing that eventually solved it

- 1 was the Ethernet cable.
- Witness Yes.
- 3 HSGAC Majority But you don't know whether and how the
- 4 connection to the cell networks played a role in it getting
- 5 reconnected. Is that a fair assessment?
- 6 Witness Yeah. I don't -- I don't think the cell
- 7 tower was the problem, just because shortly after switching
- 8 the Ethernet cable it became operational, so I don't think
- 9 it was the cell tower connection.
- 10 HSGAC Majority Okay. Acting Director Rowe recently
- 11 testified before our Committee and the Judiciary Committee
- 12 about this question, and Senator Grassley noted that the
- 13 Secret Service has told Congress that cellular bandwidth
- 14 problems was the cause of the equipment not being
- operational. And in response, Acting Director Rowe said,
- 16 "Because of the connectivity challenge, as you noted, there
- was a delay, and he" == being Crooks -- "flew his drone at
- 18 3:51." And Director Rowe said that "moving forward we are
- 19 leveraging resources from DHS and others to make sure that
- we have dedicated connectivity so that we're not reliant on
- 21 public domain."
- 22 Do you have an understanding of what Director Rowe
- 23 means there by not relying on public domain for this
- 24 equipment?
- 25 Witness I can only be guessing, but so I don't

- want to guess. I don't know what -- yeah, I don't know 1 2 what he's referring to. **HSGAC** Majority 3 Okay. When you called the company --4 sorry, 5 Witness **HSGAC** Majority 6 , did you call like a 1-7 800 number and have to go through an automated system, or did you have a direct contact that you called directly? 8 It was a, I believe, an 888 number. 9 HSGAC Majority Did you have to go through an automated 10 11 system to connect? 12 I believe it just rang, and then there's Witness somebody who answered or who didn't. 13 **HSGAC** Majority 14 Do you remember how long it took for you 15 to connect to someone, to start troubleshooting with the 16 company? Witness 17 It was not immediately, but it -- again, I would have to be guessing. I don't know exactly, but it 18 19 wasn't immediately, but I did get ahold of them fairly 20 quickly.
- HSGAC Majority And did you personally have any problems
  with cell service, either your personal cellphone or your
  work cellphone, that day?
- Witness Yes.
- 25 **HSGAC Majority** And what were those problems?

- Witness It was just trouble making phone calls, 1 trouble sending text messages and receiving text messages. 2 3 And this was only apparent after the event. I don't recall any issues before that. 4 **HSGAC** Majority After the event, you mean later that 5 6 night? 7 Later that night, yes. Witness **HSGAC** Majority So you didn't have any issues with 8 9 either your work of personal cellphone during the day or leading up to the shots fired or in the immediate aftermath 10 11 of the shots fired? You didn't have any issues with cell 12 service? Witness In the aftermath, yes. 13 HSGAC Majority 14 How soon after the aftermath? 15 Witness Yeah, I want to say almost immediately 16 afterwards. HSGAC Majority 17 And were those issues on your personal cellphone or your work cellphone? 18 19 My work cellphone. Witness **HSGAC** Majority And what did you struggle with --20 Phone calls? Emails? 21 sending texts? 22 Just making phone calls. Phone calls is Witness 2.3 what I remember. I think I tried to send a text message to
  - HSGAC Majority You had stated earlier that when you

one of the shift and it wasn't going out.

- 1 were in the Security Room with the PSP sergeant and he had
- 2 the photos of a suspicious person, you had asked him -- I
- 3 think you said you had asked him to send it to your
- 4 personal cellphone. Is that right?
- 5 Witness Yes.
- 6 HSGAC Majority And I think you said the reason for that
- 7 is that you had problems with photos on your work
- 8 cellphone. Can you elaborate what those problems were?
- 9 Witness Yeah. I don't think they're problems.
- 10 They're inherent issues with security systems that are
- 11 built into the phones, where it has trouble sending out
- 12 pictures.
- HSGAC Majority So this is a general capability problem
- 14 that you're describing --
- Witness Yes.
- 16 **HSGAC Majority** -- rather than a problem with cell
- 17 service at that particular site, on that particular day.
- 18 Is that right?
- 19 Witness That's correct.
- 20 HSGAC Majority So you don't generally use your work
- 21 cellphone to send or receive photos, at least via text. Is
- 22 that right?
- 23 Witness Yes, generally through email, not text.
- HSGAC Majority And the reason you asked the PSP
- 25 sergeant to send to your personal cellphone is because it

- 1 would just be easier, as opposed to giving him your email?
- 2 Witness Faster, yeah. I wanted to get it to him
- 3 faster.
- 4 HSGAC Majority Okay. Do you generally have to send or
- 5 receive photos in the course of your work at events like
- 6 this? Is that generally --
- 7 Witness No.
- 8 HSGAC Majority Oh. This was unusual to receive this
- 9 photo of the suspicious person?
- 10 Witness I'm trying to recall another time that I
- 11 received a -- yeah, no. What I can remember, I don't think
- 12 I've ever received a picture of a suspicious person.
- Normally that is received by email, a specific threat,
- 14 probably the day of or the day before a visit, and it's by
- 15 email.
- 16 HSGAC Majority Okay. And you had said that you had
- 17 talked about sending out the CS Response Team to
- investigate the suspicious person. Is that right?
- Witness Yes.
- 20 **HSGAC Majority** Who did you suggest that to?
- Witness To the Security Room agent.
- HSGAC Majority Meaning the Secret Service agent in the
- 23 Security Room?
- Witness Correct.
- 25 HSGAC Majority Is that your responsibility, or is that

- 1 just an idea you had to suggest? In other words, was it
- 2 your responsibility to send out CS response, or you just
- 3 had an idea to suggest that?
- 4 Witness It was not my responsibility. I just
- 5 wanted to suggest it.
- 6 HSGAC Majority Okay. My understanding is that CS
- 7 Response works with the CS teams in position, and that day
- 8 on the barn roofs. Is that right, they generally
- 9 coordinate with the CS agents or officers?
- 10 Witness Correct. Yeah, that's correct.
- HSGAC Majority Do you know why the CS teams or the CS
- team leader, didn't do that? In other words, why they
- didn't send out the CS Response Team?
- 14 Witness So I'm not sure if -- yeah, I don't know
- why he didn't speak to them. But I just want to clarify.
- 16 The ones who I was told that received, or took those
- 17 pictures was the local CS, which would be different from
- 18 Secret Service CS.
- 19 HSGAC Majority Understood. So you're not aware of
- 20 whether the Secret Service CS was even aware of the
- 21 suspicious person at that point.
- Witness Correct. I'm not aware.
- 23 HSGAC Majority Understood. And it was Special Agent
- 24 CSRT Agent --
- 25 Witness Yes, he was the CS Response.

HSGAC Majority Do you have a sense, and apologies if 1 you said this already, do you have a sense of what he 2 3 found, what he determined when he went out to investigate? He never -- from what I understand he did 4 Witness 5 not locate the shooter until after the event, after the 6 shooting. HSGAC Majority 7 Did he relay anything to you about the presence of other law enforcement, state or local, out over 8 9 there by the AGR, who may have also been looking for the 10 suspicious person? 11 Witness No, he did not. **HSGAC** Majority 12 And going back to the CUAS equipment, did you say whether state or locals had CUAS capability 13 that day? I know we talked about them offering drones if 14 15 Secret Service needed it, but did they have CUAS 16 capabilities there that day? 17 /itness To my knowledge they did not. **HSGAC** Majority Okay. And if something goes wrong with 18 19 the detection system, the CUAS system, is there any kind of protocol for like a last resort, in other words, like a 20 21 communication out to the post-standers saying, ?Hey, we've 22 got this capability down and I need you to get extra 23 vigilant looking for drones," or anything like that. 2.4 there a protocol in place if the functionality is not up

25

and running?

- 1 Witness There's no protocol in place. In
- 2 retrospect, that's something I probably should have done.
- 3 HSGAC Majority And is there any kind of protocol for a
- 4 test run of this equipment, either the day before or the
- 5 morning of, you know, well in advance of when it's supposed
- 6 to be operational?
- 7 Witness So when I would take equipment out I
- 8 would test it before traveling, and so normally I would
- 9 test it. But me being the person that last used it and
- 10 bringing it down from Bedminster, I knew that it was
- 11 operational and working.
- HSGAC Majority And when was the last time you used it?
- 13 You said at Bedminster?
- 14 Witness Bedminster, yes.
- HSGAC Majority And when was the last time you used it
- 16 there?
- 17 Witness I don't recall the date. It was a couple
- 18 of days before.
- 19 HSGAC Majority Okay. If a drone is detected and
- 20 brought down with the second system, the system that
- 21 actually brings the drones down, whose responsibility would
- it be to go recover the drone?
- 23 Witness It will be the nearest post-stander,
- 24 depending on where the system goes down. If it's within
- 25 the site -- if it's somewhere outside the site, I'm not

- 1 sure that we would recover it. We'd be more interested in
- 2 speaking to the operator and him flying it and delivering
- 3 the drone to their location.
- 4 HSGAC Majority Are you aware of any Secret Service
- 5 protocols or policies that were deviated from or not
- 6 followed that day?
- 7 Witness Not to my knowledge, sir.
- 8 HSGAC Majority All right. I think that's all I have.
- 9 I will turn to my colleague.
- 10 HSGAC Majority You mentioned asking Agent CSRT Agent to
- 11 respond.
- Witness Yes, sir.
- 13 HSGAC Majority Who would have been the individual who
- 14 would've communicated that to him, if not you?
- 15 Witness It would have been the Security Room
- 16 agent.
- 17 HSGAC Majority And who was that?
- 18 Witness It was SAIC Buffalo -- I don't know his last
- 19 name.
- 20 HSGAC Majority Did he have radio communications on him, to
- 21 your knowledge.
- 22 Witness I'm sorry. Could you repeat the
- 23 question?
- 24 HSGAC Majority Did this individual have radio
- 25 communications capabilities?

Witness Yes, sir, he did. 1 And you don't know where he was at this 2 3 moment. He was located in the Security Room. 4 Witness 5 was in charge of communications, receiving and 6 disseminating information. 7 But you're the one that ended up asking CSRT Agent to go out. 8 9 Yes. **HSGAC** Majority 10 In response to one of my earlier questions about the reason you need two UAS, you said that one of the 11 12 threats to mitigate against is the threat of surveillance. Is that an accurate assessment of what you said? 13 14 Vitness Yes. 15 And that's because surveillance can be a 16 threat to the protectee at some point. 17 Sure. Yes, sir. itness 18 You also said that the 3:50 flight of this 19 drone, that is reported to be the time Crooks flew the drone, would've been legal because the Temporary Flight 20 21 Restriction was not operating at that time. Is that an 22 accurate statement? 2.3 That is correct. Yes, sir.

Isn't it also accurate, however, to say

that legal or not, it was still a threat that this drone

2.4

- was flown at this time?
- 2 Witness It could've been a potential threat. I
- 3 wouldn't have classified it as a threat.
- 4 HSGAC Majority Why is that?
- 5 Witness So for a threat, for it to be -- for me
- 6 to classify it as a threat, it needs to be a danger to our
- 7 protectee, which it wasn't.
- 8 HSGAC Majority It wasn't, or that wasn't something you
- 9 were able to determine at that time, on the 13th?
- 10 Witness So a -- I'm trying to explain myself. So
- 11 a threat -- it's more imminent than something suspicious.
- 12 At the time, if it was at 3:50 that it was flown, it
- would've certainly been suspicious, and something that it
- 14 would've been responded to with a -- and the operator of
- the drone would've been engaged in a consensual interview
- 16 to find out what their intentions were. But it wouldn't be
- 17 a threat.
- 18 HSGAC Majority And this interview would've occurred
- 19 because the capabilities of the CUAS allow you to detect
- 20 **LES** ?
- Witness Potentially, yes.
- 22 HSGAC Majority So among the things that went wrong that
- 23 day, would you assess that inoperability of this system for
- 24 the hours that you described, that eight-hour period, as
- one of the things that went wrong?

- 1 Witness Yes, absolutely.
  2 HSGAC Minority Was SAIC Buffalo +
- 2 HSGAC Minority Was SAIC Buffalo the special agent in
- 3 charge of the Security Room?
- 4 Witness I believe that's correct.
- 5 HSGAC Minority Okay. And what time did you enter the
- 6 Security Room again? Can you remind me?
- 7 Witness Probably approximately 9:30 that morning.
- 8 HSGAC Minority Okay. You entered the Security Room and
- 9 then remained there, or --
- 10 Witness No, I was in and out a lot.
- 11 HSGAC Minority Okay. I guess in relation to the
- shooting, so you were already in the Security Room prior to
- 13 the 5:50 notification that we discussed a little bit
- 14 earlier.
- 15 Witness Yes, ma'am.
- 16 HSGAC Minority Prior to that, how long had you been in
- 17 the Security Room?
- 18 Witness Hard to say, ma'am. I was in and out a
- 19 lot, trying to --
- 20 HSGAC Minority Do you know if it was before or after
- 21 Trump took the stage?
- 22 Witness It was before he took the stage.
- HSGAC Minority Before he took the stage. Okay. And
- 24 while you were in the Security Room, who did you see come
- in and out of the Security Room? You mentioned there were

- 1 a lot of people coming in and out.
- 2 Witness Yes. So before the event it was a place
- 3 where post-standers can grab water --
- 4 HSGAC Minority Just, so leading up, right up until that
- 5 5:50 moment, do you recall who was in the Security Room at
- 6 5:50, when that notification came through?
- 7 Witness Yeah. The ones that I can be certain
- 8 that were there was the Pennsylvania State Police sergeant
- 9 that was there the entirety of the day, the Security Room
- 10 agent, and myself.
- HSGAC Minority And that's it? So there were only three
- 12 people in there?
- 13 Witness There was probably more people there. I
- can't remember who they were, or who they are. They were
- 15 folks in and out of the room there.
- HSGAC Minority And the lead site agent, Lead Agent
- 17 she was not in there?
- 18 Witness No. So the lead travel for the entire
- 19 visit, she would not have time to be there.
- 20 HSGAC Minority Just even right up to that 5:50.
- 21 Witness So the lead -- right, no.
- HSGAC Minority Okay.
- 23 Witness That would not have been her position.
- Her position would've been leading towards the cars, in a
- 25 position leading towards the cars.

HSGAC Minority 1 Okay. Was there any discussion while you were in the Security Room from the 5:50 moment up until 2 shots fired about either -- well, I guess, first, delaying 3 the protectee from taking the stage? We'll start with 4 5 that. Witness 6 No, ma'am. **ISGAC** Minority 7 Was there any discussion about removing him from the stage once he took the stage? 8 Witness Removing President Trump? 9 HSGAC Minority 10 Right. Witness 11 No, there was not. **HSGAC Minority** 12 Due to the fact that there was someone that they were looking for. 13 14 /itness No. HSGAC Minority 15 Okay. So there was a Counter Sniper Response Team who was looking for the individual. 16 Witness 17 Yes, ma'am. HSGAC Minority 18 That communication was sent out to them around 5:50? 19 2.0 Witness I believe 5:51. **HSGAC Minority** 21 5:51. Do you know approximately what 22 time Trump took the stage? Witness 2.3 It was after that. I don't remember 24 exactly what time.

And between that time, after you made

- 1 that initial communication, were you communicating with
- them frequently? I know you discussed a couple updates.
- 3 But, I mean, were you pretty focused on remaining updated

- 13 Most of the times I did not get through. I think I got
- 14 through at least one time.
- 15 HSGAC Minority Did he sound out of breath? Did it seem
- 16 like he was running?
- 17 Witness He certainly was out of breath
- 18 afterwards. I don't remember before that.
- 19 HSGAC Minority Okay. And so we talked about Counter
- 20 Response Teams. Was there a Counter Surveillance Unit
- 21 there?
- 22 Witness There was not. No, ma'am.

- 1 Units assigned to these types of events?
- 2 Witness So there's events that have them and

- 5 Trump detail, how many events typically had Counter
- 6 Surveillance Units?
- 7 Witness I would have to guess, ma'am. I really
- 8 don't want to do that. There are some that do, some that
- 9 don't.
- 10 HSGAC Minority Do you recall the last event that you
- were at that had a Counter Surveillance Unit?
- 12 Witness No, ma'am, I don't. Sorry.
- HSGAC Minority Does the Counter Surveillance Unit, do
- 14 they have their own drones.
- Witness No, ma'am.
- 16 **HSGAC Minority** They don't?
- 17 Witness To my knowledge they do not.

- HSGAC Minority Is **ES** something that you have to like 1 physically go in and turn it on, or is it kind of always on 2 3 the background? How does it work? You have to turn it on. It's an 4 Witness application on your phone that identifies you and your role. And usually it's teams, special teams, and the shift 6 7 will be on **ES**. Is that right? 6 Witness That's not right. So they mentioned that 7 a suspicious individual was detected. They took a picture of him. And he was walking in the vicinity of the Sheetz 8 gas station. There was no communication of the AGR 9 10 building at that time. SI Minority 11 No mention of AGR building. 12 No. itness PSI Minority Okay. So when you get that message 13 about the Sheetz, I know you deploy Agent CSRT Agent to go 14 in the Security Room. 15 look up. - 19 Special Agent CSRT Agent let him know, to look on a roof
- 20 somewhere, to be looking up. And I'm -- I don't know what
- 21 Special Agent -- excuse me -- the Security Room agent put
- out on the radio. I was trying to contact CSRT Agent at the
- 23 time.
- 24 **PS Minority** Are you near him when you hear this,
- about the individual on the roof? Are you near the

- 1 Security Room agent?
- Witness Yes, I am.
- 3 PSI Minority So do you recall hearing him saying out
- 4 over the radio, "We have a report of an individual on the
- 5 roof"?
- 6 Witness I don't specifically recall whether he
- 7 did or didn't. He was putting out information.
- 8 Specifically if it was on the roof, I don't know.
- 9 PSI Minority Do you know if anybody, specifically
- 10 the Security Room agent, said, "Hey, we should alert the
- 11 counter snipers about a report of an individual on the
- 12 roof"? Or did you mention, "We should alert the counter
- snipers to an individual on the roof"?
- 14 Witness Actually, let me back up a second. I
- think he would've put it out because he had mentioned
- something about the suspicious individual being at the
- 17 three o'clock position. So I'm pretty sure that was the
- 18 Security Room agent.
- 19 PSI Minority So I just want to make sure I'm clear
- 20 on this. Your recollection is the Security Room agent
- 21 broadcast out over the radio that there's an individual on
- 22 a roof at the three o'clock position.
- 23 Witness I believe so. I can't be certain, but I
- 24 believe so.
- 25 PSI Minority Okay. Was there any discussion at that

- 1 point that you should alert the detail agents who were
- 2 surrounding the President that an individual had been
- 3 identified on the roof?
- 4 Witness So I want to clarify something. When --
- 5 it was only a very short amount of time from when I -- were
- 6 told that he was -- there was an individual on the roof.
- 7 And when I initially heard that there was an individual on
- 8 the roof, I tried to look for a roof in the vicinity of the
- 9 Sheetz gas station, and never -- it was the roof where the
- 10 local snipers were located, which was the three o'clock.
- 11 And then when we got further clarification from the
- 12 sergeant -- and again, this is a very short time period
- between -- that it was the AGR roof, at least in my mind,
- 14 and where I was looking, was looking for a building called
- 15 AGR in the vicinity of the Sheetz gas station. Never was
- it, in my mind, a building adjacent to the stage.
- 17 PS Minority I completely understand you're looking
- 18 around the Sheetz area. But I guess what I'm asking is as
- 19 this information is being relayed to you and the Security
- 20 Room from the Pennsylvania State sergeant, are you saying
- 21 to SAIC Buffalo or is anybody in the room saying, "We need to
- 22 alert the Donald Trump detail, who are behind him on the
- 23 stage, that we have identified somebody on a roof, in the
- 24 general vicinity of the rally event"?

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Witness No. There was no discussion of that.

**PSI** Minority Okay. I'm going to turn it over to my 1 colleague for a couple of questions. 2 **PSI** Minority Just a couple of quick questions, sir. 3 I know that we are very limited on time right now. Has 4 5 anyone in DHS or Secret Service instructed you not to speak 6 with Congress? 7 Witness No. PSI Minority The cable that you replaced to connect 8 the systems again, was that cable Secret Service property? 9 No. It was a Trump campaign radio and 10 Witness 11 video, audio and video personnel. 12 PSI Minority Is that standard protocol to use a cable that isn't Secret Service property in this case? 13 No. I just wanted to get the system up. 14 Witness PSI Minority 15 Did you speak to any of the Secret 16 Service counter snipers that were at the event that day regarding the shooting at the rally? 17 No, sir, I did not. 18 Witness And you mentioned that you are on the 19 PSI Minority 20 shift? shift. 21 No. Witness **PSI** Minority You're shift. And shift was there 22 23 that day. 2.4 Was working the event. Yes, sir. Witness

Are you familiar with how long

- Witness It's varied, and no, I don't know
- 4 specifically.
- 5 PSI Minority Witness apologies. One last
- 6 question here. So I know we just talked through the alert
- 7 process and sending out communications over the radio.
- 8 Knowing what you know now, in your professional opinion, do
- 9 you believe it would've been prudent to alert either the
- 10 counter snipers or Donald Trump's detail to the specific
- 11 communication about an individual on the roof at the three
- 12 o'clock?
- 13 Witness Knowing what I know now, absolutely.
- 14 Knowing the shooter's location, yes. I want to also
- 15 clarify, there's always -- not always -- let me clarify.
- 16 It is very often suspicious individuals in the vicinity of
- a site, especially former President Trump site. And it's
- not a practice to call to the shift agents that there are
- 19 suspicious individuals in the site. They're focused on the
- 20 close-in threat. And there's personnel and teams that are
- 21 designated to handle threats outside. And that's what we
- 22 were trying to negotiate that day.
- 23 PSI Minority Understand. But somebody being up on a
- 24 roof, especially after a report of a rangefinder -- I know
- you mentioned rangefinder earlier as raising a suspicion

- level -- that sort of ups the ante, right?
- 2 Witness Well, in that roof specifically, where
- 3 ultimately the shooter was, yes. But if was Sheetz gas
- 4 station, I don't want to guess, but it's approximately a
- 5 mile away from what we thought where his location was.
- 6 Knowing what I know then, I would've done the same, not
- 7 contacted the shift, a person on a roof one mile away. I
- 8 don't think I would've alerted the shift for that and
- 9 declare -- it's not something I would've done, either the
- 10 Security Room or the site agent would've done that. But
- 11 knowing what I know now, a person on the roof immediately
- 12 adjacent to the stage, then yes, that's something that I
- would've alerted the shift, or somebody should have alerted
- 14 the shift.
- 15 **PSI Minority** Thank you.
- 16 HSGAC Minority I just have one quick follow-up. Is
- 17 there anything that you did not answer fully or felt like
- 18 you couldn't answer fully because it may or may not be
- 19 classified?
- Witness No, ma'am. My only concern was the
- 21 **ES** system and its capabilities. But no.
- HSGAC Minority Okay. Thank you.
- 23 MR. PI : Is everyone still there?
- 24 HSGAC Majority Yes, we're still here.
- 25 MR. : Okay.

**HSGAC** Majority In addition to the shortcomings you 1 identified earlier about the operability of the CUAS 2 3 system, from your time becoming involved on July 11th through the events you described just now, are there any 4 5 other shortcomings you could identify as it relates to 6 planning, communications, coordination, or anything else? 7 So shortcomings, are you thinking --Vitness would that include a lack of systems available, or --8 9 Within anything that you, in your role, or in your observation that day, believe contributed to the 10 11 attempt, or the ability? 12 Yes, sir. So two things I'd like to Witness point out. First, I would've liked to have a 13 there. I feel like that's a system that we were -- we 14 15 should have had out there. And secondly, I think there 16 were local assets that were -- excuse me -- local law 17 enforcement personnel that were at the site who we did not 18 have representatives for in the Security Room. 19 would've helped greatly with communication. **HSGAC** Majority And can you identify -- there were several 2.0 local entities. Can you identify which ones you did not 21 22 have in that room that would've been helpful? 2.3 Witness No, sir, because I'm not familiar with 2.4 exactly all the entities that were supporting. I could

probably name a few, but I don't know every single one.

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- 1 But to my point is if there was a local entity there, there
- 2 should've been a representative in the Security Room.
- 3 Those are the two changes I would've hoped happened.
- 4 HSGAC Minority Who makes the decision about who is
- 5 represented in the Security Room?
- 6 Witness I will have to say the site agent,
- 7 possibly.
- 8 HSGAC Minority Okay. And just one more. Are you aware
- 9 -- so we talked about the **ES** system -- are you aware of
- any other resources or equipment requests by the Trump
- 11 protective detail to Secret Service that were denied, not
- 12 provided in full, unanswered?
- 13 Witness I'm only aware of the ones I requested,
- 14 which was the **ES** system and the **ES**.
- 15 HSGAC Minority Okay. And were there any rumors about
- any other requests that had been made, that you've heard?
- Witness No, ma'am.
- 18 HSGAC Minority Okay.
- 19 HSGAC Majority So as my colleagues have stated, but I'd
- 20 like to address to DHS and Secret Service counsel --
- 21 MR. Witness Counsel Are we coming to an end? Are we coming
- 22 to an end on this, or what?
- 23 HSGAC Majority We are concluding after my comment right
- 24 now.
- 25 MR. Witness Counsel Okay. Thank you.

1	For counsel, SA Witness has identified
2	images and communications that would be responsive to our
3	requests, which we believe we do not have. Those should be
4	provided to us, and we'd ask that you follow up with us and
