I am writing to invite you to testify before the Subcommittee on Contracting Oversight at a hearing entitled, "Improving the Ability of Inspectors General to Detect, Prevent, and Prosecute Contracting Fraud." The hearing will be held on Tuesday, April 21, 2009 at 2:30 P.M. in Room SD-342 of the Dirksen Senate Office Building.

The purpose of the hearing is to hear testimony from Inspectors General regarding obstacles to their investigation of contracting fraud. The hearing will also discuss legal and regulatory reforms suggested last year by the National Procurement Fraud Task Force Legislative Committee, including establishing a national procurement fraud database and allowing the use of Social Security numbers in the Excluded Parties List System.

As Chairman of the Legislation Committee of the Council of Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency, your testimony should address the recommendations of the National Procurement Fraud Task Force. You should also provide other recommendations for reforms that you wish to have considered by Congress and the Administration. In addition, I ask that you speak to the coordination of efforts between and among agency inspectors general, agency officials, and the Department of Justice.

The Subcommittee requests that you summarize your testimony in 5 minutes, although a longer written statement may be submitted for the official record. This will allow adequate time for you to engage in questions and answers with members of the Subcommittee. Subcommittee rules require that your testimony be submitted by 2:30 P.M. on Friday, April 17, 2009.
