We are writing to invite you to testify before the Subcommittee on Contracting Oversight at a hearing entitled, "Contracting Preferences for Alaska Native Corporations." The hearing will be held on Thursday, July 16, 2009 at 2:30 P.M. in Room SD-342 of the Dirksen Senate Office Building.

The purpose of the hearing is to examine concerns relating to the award of contracts to Alaska Native Corporations (ANCs) through the Small Business Administration's 8(a) program. The preference given to Alaska Native Corporations in federal procurement was intended to provide economic opportunities for impoverished Alaskan communities. In recent years, however, critics have identified these preferences as a vehicle for avoiding competition and passing work through to large, non-ANC contractors. The hearing will examine new findings from federal auditors and explore alleged abuses in the award, management, and oversight of these contract vehicles.


Your testimony should focus on issues relating to your company's experience as a former 8(a) program participant and current Service Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business. You should also address your experience with ANCs' utilization of no-limit sole-source preferences to obtain federal contracts and the affect these preferences have on businesses' ability to provide the taxpayer and the federal government with value and choice in contract awards.

The Subcommittee requests that you summarize your testimony in 5 minutes, although a longer written statement may be submitted for the official record. This will allow adequate time for you to engage in questions and answers with members of the Subcommittee. Subcommittee rules require that your testimony be submitted by 2:30 P.M. on Tuesday, July 14, 2009.
