We are writing to invite you to testify before the Subcommittee on Contracting Oversight at a hearing entitled, "Oversight of Reconstruction Contracts in Afghanistan and the Role of the Special Inspector General." The hearing will be held on Thursday, November 18, 2010 at 2:30 P.M. in Room SD-342 of the Dirksen Senate Office Building. This will be the fourth in a series of hearings held by the Subcommittee on oversight of government contracts in Afghanistan.

The purpose of the hearing is to examine the role of the Special Inspector General for Afghanistan Reconstruction (SIGAR) in providing independent oversight of reconstruction contracts in Afghanistan. The hearing will review recent SIGAR audits and investigations and assess SIGAR's effectiveness at preventing and detecting waste, fraud, and abuse of taxpayer dollars. In addition, you should be prepared to discuss the feasibility and advisability of creating a permanent Inspector General to oversee contingency operations.

The Subcommittee requests that you summarize your testimony in 5 minutes, although a longer written statement may be submitted for the official record. This will allow adequate time for you to engage in questions and answers with members of the Subcommittee. Subcommittee rules require that your testimony be submitted by no later than 2:30 P.M. on Tuesday, November 16, 2010.
