Dear Mr. Dodaro:

I am writing to you to request that the Government Accountability Office (GAO) review federal agencies' compliance with Section 102(b) of the Comprehensive Iran Sanctions, Accountability, and Divestment Act of 2010 (CISADA).

Section 102(b) of CISADA amended the Iran Sanctions Act of 1996 (ISA) to require prospective government contractors to certify that neither they nor their affiliates were engaged in sanctioned activity in Iran. If a contractor submits a false certification, agencies may terminate the contract or propose the contractor for suspension or debarment. Under CISADA, the certification requirement may be waived by the President in the interests of national security, provided that a written certification of the waiver is submitted to Congress.²

To ensure that federal agencies are complying with the government contracting provisions of CISADA, I request that GAO assess the following: (1) agency and contractor compliance with the certification; (2) how many reports of false certifications have been investigated by agencies; (3) the outcomes of these investigations; (4) how many contractors have been suspended or debarred for engaging in sanctioned activity in Iran; and (5) how many waivers of certification have been requested and how many granted. I also request that GAO examine the extent to which agencies and contractors are applying the CISADA requirements to subcontractors.
