I am writing to request a briefing regarding the Federal Awardee Performance Integrity and Information System (FAPIIS). As you know, I worked hard to require the creation of FAPIIS to improve the transparency and accountability of the federal procurement process by creating a single, searchable database of contractor misconduct.

I recently learned that FAPIIS may have a system limitation which could prevent it from functioning properly. As currently designed and deployed, FAPIIS tracks data about contractors using the Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) number. However, contractors often have different DUNS numbers for different parts of their organizations. Therefore, when a contracting officer views a contractor's information in FAPIIS, the information displayed is only for a particular DUNS number and not the entire corporate entity. As a result, contracting officers may be missing pertinent information regarding the contractor's record of misconduct.

The use of DUNS numbers may also mean that FAPIIS is not in compliance with its legal requirements. In 2009, Congress required the creation of "a database of information regarding the integrity and performance of certain persons awarded Federal agency contracts and grants". If FAPIIS cannot display information for each corporate entity, as opposed to the individual DUNS numbers, it may not be meeting the requirement that it display information about each person receiving federal contracts.

To assist the Subcommittee in understanding these issues, I request that you provide a briefing for Subcommittee staff regarding the operation of FAPIIS. I request that you provide the briefing as soon as possible, but in no case later than **Friday**, **July 29**, **2011**.
