Dear Dr. Berwick:

I am writing to request a briefing regarding new developments with the Medicare Secondary Payer Recovery Contractor (MSPRC).

On April 28, 2010, the Subcommittee held a hearing entitled, "Oversight of Contract Management at the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services." At the hearing, I released a fact sheet summarizing the Subcommittee's investigation of the MSPRC contract. The Subcommittee found ongoing problems with the performance of the contractor, Chickasaw Nation Industries (CNI), which had been awarded the contract without competition. At the time, CNI officials acknowledged to the Subcommittee that it had failed to meet several contract requirements, including requirements relating to the timely performance of its recovery duties, but that it had some improvements.

I recently learned that CMS may not renew its contract with CNI when it expires on November 1, 2011. Instead, CMS will combine its MSPRC and Coordination of Benefits Contractor (COBC) contracts into one contract. Until the new contract is awarded, the MSPRC will be taken over by Group Health Incorporated (GHI), which is the current COBC.³ The

solicitation for the Medicare Secondary Payer Integration Contractor (MSPIC) was posted on the Federal Business Opportunities website on August 24, 2011.⁴

To better understand how you intend to ensure that these contracts are as efficient and effective as possible, I request a briefing regarding your plans for the MSPRC contract, including the factors considered in any decision not to renew the contract with CNI and the extent to which you plan to use competition for a new contract.

The jurisdiction of the Subcommittee on Contracting Oversight is set forth in Senate Rule XXV clause 1(k); Senate Resolution 445 section 101 (108th Congress); and Senate Resolution 73 (111th Congress). An attachment to this letter provides additional information about how to respond to the Subcommittee's request.
