We are writing to invite you or your designee to testify before the Subcommittee on Financial and Contracting Oversight at a hearing entitled, "A More Efficient and Effective Government: Streamlining and Strengthening Oversight of Overseas Development Agencies." Subcommittee rules require that your testimony be submitted by no later than 10:30 A.M. on December 9, 2013.
