Dear Chairman Boozman and Ranking Member Tester:

Federal funds have begun to flow into Houston and many counties in Texas in enormous sums. To date, FEMA has provided nearly \$3 billion in emergency funding for the Hurricane Harvey response and recovery. Ultimately, the damage from Hurricane Harvey may total between \$150 billion to \$180 billion.²

Immediate and intensive oversight efforts by Offices of Inspectors General (OIG) and the Government Accountability Office (GAO) are essential to protect the interests of the taxpayer and to ensure that hurricane relief funds reach the victims of Hurricane Harvey.

I write to urge the Appropriations Committee to ensure that the OIGs of agencies that receive Hurricane Harvey funding and GAO are appropriately funded. I recommend that the budgets of relevant OIGs increase proportionally to any Hurricane Harvey disaster funding the agencies receive and that GAO receive funding sufficient to perform additional oversight work related to the Hurricane Harvey response and recovery. This will enable these entities to continue their missions to conduct audits and perform investigations.
