Dear Attorney General Barr and Director Wray:

The Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs is continuing its oversight of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and its Crossfire Hurricane investigation. On Wednesday, December 18, 2019, Department of Justice Inspector General Michael Horowitz will testify before the Committee about his findings in the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) report on the FBI's Crossfire Hurricane investigation. I am writing to request information from or related to that report to help the committee prepare for that hearing and to better understand its findings.¹

Specifically, I respectfully request that you provide the following information and material to the Committee by no later than December 17, 2019:

- 1. The names of the individuals the OIG did not disclose in its report.
- 2. The total number of FBI employees assigned to the Crossfire Hurricane investigation over the full course of its existence.
- 3. All transcripts of recordings by confidential human sources and undercover employees from the Crossfire Hurricane investigation.

The Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs is authorized by Rule XXV of the Standing Rules of the Senate to investigate "the efficiency, economy, and effectiveness of all agencies and departments of the Government." Additionally, Senate Resolution 70 (116th Congress) authorizes the Committee to examine "the efficiency and economy of operations of all branches of the Government[.]"
