AN ACT

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish the Intelligence Rotational Assignment Program in the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “DHS Intelligence Ro-
3 tational Assignment Program Act of 2019”.

4 **SEC. 2. INTELLIGENCE ROTATIONAL ASSIGNMENT PRO-**
5 **GRAM.**

6 Section 844 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
7 (6 U.S.C. 414) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
8 lowing new subsection:

9 “(b) INTELLIGENCE ROTATIONAL ASSIGNMENT PRO-
10 GRAM.—

11 “(1) ESTABLISHMENT.—Not later than 1 year
12 after the date of the enactment of this section, the
13 Secretary shall establish an Intelligence Rotational
14 Assignment Program as part of the Rotation Pro-
15 gram under subsection (a).

16 “(2) ADMINISTRATION.—The Chief Human
17 Capital Officer, in conjunction with the Chief Intel-
18 ligence Officer, shall administer the Intelligence Ro-
19 tational Assignment Program established pursuant
20 to paragraph (1).

21 “(3) ELIGIBILITY.—The Intelligence Rotational
22 Assignment Program shall be open to employees
23 serving in existing analyst positions within the De-
24 partment’s Intelligence Enterprise and other Depart-
25 ment employees as determined appropriate by the

1 Chief Human Capital Officer and the Chief Intel-
2 ligence Officer.

3 “(4) COORDINATION.—The responsibilities
4 specified in paragraph (3)(B) of subsection (a) that
5 apply to the Rotation Program under such sub-
6 section shall, as applicable, also apply to the Intel-
7 ligence Rotational Assignment Program under this
8 subsection.”.
