4	This Act may be cited as the "Securing Healthcare		
5	and Response Equipment Act of 2020" or the "SHARE		
6	Act of 2020".		
7	SEC. 2. TRANSFER OF EQUIPMENT DURING A PUBLIC		
8	HEALTH EMERGENCY.		
9	(a) Amendment.—Title V of the Homeland Security		
10	Act of $2002$ (6 U.S.C. $311$ ) is amended by adding at the		
11	end the following:		

1	"SEC. 529. TRANSFER OF EQUIPMENT DURING A PUBLIC
2	HEALTH EMERGENCY.
3	"(a) Authorization of Transfer of Equip-
4	MENT.—During a public health emergency declared by the
5	Secretary of Health and Human Services under section
6	319(a) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
7	247d(a)), the Secretary, at the request of the Secretary
8	of Health and Human Services, may transfer to the De-
9	partment of Health and Human Services, on a reimburs-
10	able basis, excess personal protective equipment or medi-
11	cally necessary equipment in the possession of the Depart-
12	ment.
13	"(b) Determination by Secretaries.—
14	"(1) In general.—In carrying out this sec-
15	tion—
16	"(A) before requesting a transfer under
17	subsection (a), the Secretary of Health and
18	Human Services shall determine whether the
19	personal protective equipment or medically nec-
20	essary equipment is otherwise available; and
21	"(B) before initiating a transfer under
22	subsection (a), the Secretary, in consultation
23	with the heads of each component within the
24	Department of Homeland Security, shall—
25	"(i) determine whether the personal
26	protective equipment or medically nec-

1	essary equipment requested to be trans-
2	ferred under subsection (a) is excess equip-
3	ment; and
4	"(ii) certify that the transfer of the
5	personal protective equipment or medically
6	necessary equipment will not adversely im-
7	pact the health or safety of officers, em-
8	ployees, or contractors of the Department
9	of Homeland Security.
10	"(2) Notification.—The Secretary of Health
11	and Human Services and the Secretary shall each
12	submit to Congress a notification explaining the de-
13	termination made under subparagraphs (A) and (B),
14	respectively, of paragraph (1).
15	"(3) Required inventory.—
16	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall—
17	"(i) acting through the Chief Medical
18	Officer of the Department, maintain an in-
19	ventory of all personal protective equip-
20	ment and medically necessary equipment in
21	the possession of the Department; and
22	"(ii) make the inventory required
23	under clause (i) available, on a continual
24	basis, to—

1	"(I) the Secretary of Health and
2	Human Services; and
3	"(II) the Committee on Appro-
4	priations and the Committee on
5	Homeland Security and Governmental
6	Affairs of the Senate and the Com-
7	mittee on Appropriations and the
8	Committee on Homeland Security of
9	the House of Representatives.
10	"(B) FORM.—Each inventory required to
11	be made available under subparagraph (A) shall
12	be submitted in unclassified form, but may in-
13	clude a classified annex.".
14	(b) Table of Contents Amendment.—The table
15	of contents in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act
16	of 2002 (Public Law 107–296; 116 Stat. 2135) is amend-
17	ed by inserting after the item relating to section 528 the
18	following:
	"Sec. 529. Transfer of equipment during a public health emergency.".
19	(c) Strategic National Stockpile.—Section
20	319F–2(a) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
21	247d-6b(a)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
22	lowing:
23	"(6) Transfers of Items.—The Secretary, in
24	coordination with the Secretary of Homeland Secu-
25	rity, may sell drugs, vaccines and other biological

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1	products, medical devices, or other supplies main-
2	tained in the stockpile under paragraph (1) to a
3	Federal agency or private, nonprofit, State, local,
4	tribal, or territorial entity for immediate use and
5	distribution, provided that any such items being sold
6	are—
7	"(A) within 1 year of their expiration date;
8	or
9	"(B) determined by the Secretary to no
10	longer be needed in the stockpile due to ad-
11	vances in medical or technical capabilities.".
