  - 3 SECTION 1. PORT MAINTENANCE.
- 4 (a) In General.—Section 411(o) of the Homeland
- 5 Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 211(o)) is amended—
- 6 (1) by redesignating paragraph (3) as para-
- 7 graph (4); and

1	(2) by inserting after paragraph (2) the fol-
2	lowing:
3	"(3) Port maintenance.—
4	"(A) Procedures.—Subject to subpara-
5	graphs (B) and (C), the Commissioner shall es-
6	tablish procedures by which U.S. Customs and
7	Border Protection may conduct maintenance
8	and repair projects costing not more than
9	\$300,000 at any port of entry where the Office
10	of Field Operations performs any of the activi-
11	ties described in subparagraphs (A) through
12	(G) of subsection (g)(3).
13	"(B) Limitation.—The authority under
14	subparagraph (A) shall only be available for
15	maintenance and repair projects involving exist-
16	ing infrastructure, property, and capital at any
17	port of entry described in subparagraph (A).
18	"(C) ANNUAL ADJUSTMENTS.—The Com-
19	missioner shall annually adjust the amount de-
20	scribed in subparagraph (A) by the percentage
21	(if any) by which the Consumer Price Index for
22	All Urban Consumers for the month of June
23	preceding the date on which such adjustment
24	takes effect exceeds the Consumer Price Index

1	for All Urban Consumers for the same month
2	of the preceding calendar year.
3	"(D) Rule of Construction.—Nothing
4	in this paragraph may be construed to affect
5	the availability of funding from—
6	"(i) the Federal Buildings Fund es-
7	tablished under section 592 of title 40,

9	"(ii) the Donation Acceptance Pro-
10	gram established under section 482; or
11	"(iii) any other statutory authority or
12	appropriation for projects described in sub-

14	(b) Reporting.—
15	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
16	the date of the enactment of this Act, and annually
17	thereafter, the Commissioner of U.S. Customs and
18	Border Protection shall submit a report to the Com-
19	mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Af-
20	fairs of the Senate, the Committee on Appropria-
21	tions of the Senate, the Committee on Homeland Se-
22	curity of the House of Representatives, and the
23	Committee on Appropriations of the House of Rep-
24	resentatives that includes the elements described in
25	paragraph (2).

1	(2) Elements.—The report required under
2	paragraph (1) shall include—
3	(A) a summary of all maintenance projects
4	conducted pursuant to section 411(o)(3) of the
5	Homeland Security Act of 2002, as added by
6	subsection (a) during the prior fiscal year;
7	(B) the cost of each project referred to in
8	subparagraph (A);
9	(C) the account that funded each such
10	project, if applicable; and
11	(D) any budgetary transfers, if applicable,
12	that funded each such project.
